COUNTING THE COST... Of Following Jesus

It has now been forty years since God touched my heart in a very special way. FORTY YEARS!... I can't believe it has been that long. I remember that day as if it were yesterday. It was an incredible experience and I remember at the time asking myself 'what did just happen to me?' I had been searching for such a long time for 'something'...
